program carried out by the Security Intelligence Review Committee (SIRC).

has grown, while at the same time, technology has advanced at a
pace that, at times, has surpassed jurisprudence on the expectation of privacy. Annex A
provides background information.

Overall, SIRC found that CSIS activities conducted under the program between January 1, 2015, and January 31, 2017, complied with the CSIS Act and ministerial direction on operational activities. CSIS activities were also consistent with the authorities and limitations set out in its targeting policy.
